Ms. Sandra Fancher: Fancher's peers nominated her because "she challenges her students to be independent, to take control of their learning, to be problem solvers, to think outside the box, and to feel good about themselves." They also noted that "creativity overflows from Ms. Fancher's classroom" and praised her for how she "stays up to date on the latest research and tries out new techniques that she thinks might help her students."

Ericka Silverman: Silverman was praised by parents not only because she "helped organize many programs at our school like PARP (Pick A Reading Partner), STEAM, and many more" but also because she "has a knack for showcasing each child's strengths" to "create a successful and happy learning experience!"

We also had a special visit from Hudson, the Railroad Puppy. Hudson was adopted and became one of the first dogs in New York to receive a prosthetic limb and was honored as the American Humane Association's hero therapy dog of the year in 2015. Hudson has overcome huge obstacles, and is very lovable.
