### **PROPOSITION NO. 2:**

The Diver Memorial Library and Valley Falls Library submitted a petition to the Board of Education for the following proposition to be placed before the voters on May 17: Shall the annual appropriation from the Hoosic Valley School District budget for library purposes be increased from \$50,000 to \$60,000 and be distributed equally to Diver Memorial Library and the Valley Falls Library?


### **Hoosic Valley Community,**

The proposed budget maintains current programs and services. The largest part of the school budget remains salaries and benefits at 69.57%, the next is BOCES at 10.31% and Debt Service at 7.58% while the remaining 12.54% represents all other expenses such as energy, teacher supplies, building repairs and district contractual obligations.
